We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of ELTECH ENGINEERS MADRAS PRIVATE LIMITED, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2018, the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Standalone Financial Statements
